HACC/Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry

April 29 update-HACC provided 'Food Boxes', toiletries, fresh potatoes, vegetables/fruits from Food Pro, tomato plants starters and packs of garden seeds. These items were distributed to 85 families (132 adults & 70 children) with 17 being new.

May 27 focused on cookout items-hot dogs, hamburgers, buns, baked beans, ketchup, mustard, and mayo in addition to regular a 'Food Box' and produce. Orrs Market donated 28 cakes and 64 quarts of strawberries. This month saw 57 families (100 adults & 53 children) and 8 new families.

During each distribution our 'Prayer Warriors' visit with the families and provide individual prayers/blessings per their request.

Looking ahead - June's focus is cleaning supplies-dish soap, laundry detergent, wipes, paper towels and all-purpose cleaners.
